Greetings once again from the FHS Bands! It is hard to believe that we are now in May and that the end of the school year is almost in sight. It has been a great year for our band program and all four symphonic bands. All four bands are hard at work preparing for our final two concerts of the year. The May Band

Concert will be held on Tuesday May 21st (7:00 pm, Kolze Auditorium) and features the Concert Band and Symphonic Band. The "Senior Recognition" Band Concert will be on Wednesday May

22nd (7:00 pm, Kolze Auditorium). This concert pays tribute to our fifty-four senior band students and also features Symphonic Winds and Wind Symphony. We hope to see you at either one or both of these events!

We are very proud to be graduating fifty-four seniors from our band program this spring. While we will greatly miss our talented senior class, next year's enrollment is outstanding. The incoming freshman class is currently consists of 115 students, with a total of 305 students enrolled in our bands next fall. Due to our large freshmen class we have added a fifth band to the program. The bands will consist of two equal Concert Bands (meeting separate class periods), Symphonic Band, Symphonic Winds, and Wind Symphony.

The Wind Symphony was very busy during the month of April, performing at the Hersey High School "Chicagoland Invitational Concert Band Festival" and the Illinois State University "State of Illinois Concert Band Contest". The band performed well at the Hersey festival, and also received straight "Division 1/Superior" ratings by all three collegiate judges at Illinois State University. At ISU, the band also received third place honors for the 6A division, and the eighth highest point total out of twenty-five participating bands. More importantly, the students had the opportunity to perform in a phenomenal concert hall, going home with an excellent CD recording of "Carmina Burana", "Pacem: A Hymn of Peace", and "Fantasia in G". Congratulations to all members of the Wind Symphony for their hard work and dedication to our very challenging festival program!

On May 2nd and 6th all four of our bands had the opportunity to work with guest conductor Ron Polancich. Mr. Polancich is a retired high school band director from York High School and has taught on the faculties of Northwestern University, DePaul University, Roosevelt College, and Augustana College. All four of our bands greatly enjoyed working with him and his vast knowledge of band music. Mr. Polancich has also been selected as the guest conductor for the District 211 Honor Band festival on May 17th and 18th.

Congratulations to our twenty-eight Wind Symphony students selected to perform in the District 211 Honor Band. The D211 Honor Band will perform on Saturday May 18th, 2:00 pm in Hoffman Estates High School auditorium. The Viking Marching Band will host two "Clinic Days" on May 7th and 8th from 3:00-6:00 pm both days. The "Clinic Days" are required for all current FHS band students and incoming freshmen that are interested in participating in the fall VMB, but have never marched before. Please join us if you are new to the VMB!

The Viking Marching Band 2013 Fall Production will be George Gershwin's classic "Rhapsody in Blue", arranged for marching band by composer Craig Jordan. The show consists of three separate movements, timing out to just over eight minutes in length. The VMB will also perform their 2013 Pre-game Show at all five home football games. The music will consist of three current/pop marching band arrangements in addition to the "Star Spangled Banner" and the "FHS Fight Song". The Viking Marching Band's summer "Band Camp" will be held August 12-17 in the afternoon/evening at FHS. August 12-16 will be from 12-8 pm each day with a dinner break from 4-5:30 pm. On Saturday August 17th we will rehearse from 8-11:30 am, followed by our "Band Camp Finale and Picnic" at 12:00 pm. Please plan for our VMB Band Camp accordingly if your son/daughter is participating in the Viking Marching Band.





Our vocal chamber night on Tuesday March 5th ended up being cancelled, due to inclement weather. We were able to host the event on Tuesday March 12th, with a nice sized group of students performing for Ms. Kubera, who is one of our voice teachers. She was able to provide excellent feedback as well as coach the students on the spot. Thank you to Ms. Kubera, and all the participating students, for their efforts in Vocal Chamber Night part 3.

Choir numbers and participation for next year are looking very good. Our incoming Freshman Treble Choir is currently around 35 students, and we are getting several freshmen boys for Viking Chorale as well. Total enrollment is currently around 124 students, and we project a few more to continue signing up for choir throughout the summer.

On April 6th, we hosted the D211 Honors Chorus Festival at Holy Family Church. The guest conductor was Dr. James Stegall, from Western Illinois University. The students rehearsed with him all day Thursday April 4th and spoke very highly of his conducting, rehearsal technique, vocal technique, as well as his personality and demeanor. The concert went well; our own Chamber Singers were able to perform one of their Choral Classics songs, "Sleep My Child" by Eric Whitacre, at the concert. Each D211 school contributed a vocal group of their own, in addition to the five songs prepared by the D211 Honors Chorus and Dr. Stegall. Thank you to all participants, supporters, and especially to our guest conductor, Dr. Stegall, for providing the students with such a meaningful musical experience.

Congratulations to Shi Yeon Choi for her excellent performance of "Laudamus Te" from Mozart's *Mass in C* at Concerto Aria April 12th. Her hard work and dedication paid off with such a vocally demanding piece. Thank you to Shi Yeon for your passion to Concerto Aria, Mrs. Caballero for providing such an opportunity for our vocal students, and for all supporters and attendees.

Our Choral Classics Concert was on April 17th at Cutting Hall, which proved to be a welcome change from our previous venue due to seating logistics. It is a beautiful, classy venue with excellent acoustics, and the students performed with heart, passion, and honesty. Their combined number of "How Can I Keep From Singing" received many compliments. Anna Karnick and Emily Worthem sang their solos from their IHSA performances where they received a "Best of Day" award from their respective judges. Thank you to the students for your patience with taking buses to the dress rehearsal and performance, for your flexibility with the new venue, and to all parents and family members for your continued support.

We hosted a new event this year, *Acaspectacular*, which took place Friday April 26th at Countryside Church. This event featured our 3 a cappella groups – Vocal Jazz, Men's A Cappella, Audial Sunshine – performing a total set of 22 songs, with a focus on more popular, contemporary music. We covered many artists, such as Ellie Goulding, Al Green, Gavin DeGraw, Maroon 5, and even Britney Spears. We also included some classic jazz standards such as "It Don't Mean A Thing", "Lullaby of Birdland", and "I'll Be Seeing You". The event was a success and we received a lot of positive feedback, so we look forward to continuing this event in the future.

Our next and final concert of the year is Senior Recognition on Thursday May 30th. There are two dress rehearsal days, one on Tuesday and the other on Wednesday, both after school; two of the choirs will be one day and the other two choirs will be the other day. Please stay tuned, as scheduling has not yet been finalized. Seniors have been instructed to turn in their program bios and pictures by May 17^{th.} I will then format everything, put it into the program, and submit it to Faculty Services for copying May 22nd. That is a hard deadline, which means a student will be omitted from the program if they have not turned in their bio and

pictures when the program gets submitted to Faculty Services. Please contact me if you have any questions about what is needed, or simply ask a fellow student for the list that was passed out in class.

I also want to remind you all that students are wearing their own uniform for our final concert. Men are expected to be in shirt and tie (a sport coat is also a nice option). Women traditionally wear a longer, more flowery spring-type dress or skirt that helps add visual color to the concert. Shoes should be flats or a very low heel. Parents, please be sure that socks and shoes match and are appropriate, and that skirt/dress lengths are appropriate. Your student should be dressed professionally and in accordance with the school dress code. Feel free to ask me questions if any clarification is needed regarding dress.

LADIES, ARE YOU FINISHED USING YOUR BAND/ORCHESTRA PERFORMANCE UNIFORM?

FMA would like to reduce the cost of girl's performance uniforms used by the Fremd Bands and Orchestras. As students leave the program, we are asking that girls either sell or donate their uniforms through FMA to band and orchestra students for reuse. If you choose to sell your uniform, the proceeds (if the item sells) will be sent to you. If you choose to donate your uniform, the proceeds will be contributed to FMA.

Senior girls, or those leaving the band and orchestra program, can turn in their performance uniform after their last performance up to the last day of school. All uniforms to be resold/donated must be clean and in good condition, with each item in a sealed zip bag along with a completed tag. These items will be offered for sale at half the retail price at our annual Used Instrument Sale in June, as well as offered on a "first come, first served" basis in the fall. Checks will be mailed once the item has been sold. All unsold items will be available for pickup by the seller during the month of November 2013.
